

HOW POWER IMBALANCES

ARISE

Economic leverage over:

Planning Authority- Reliance on development levies/commercial rates

Politicians- Political donations is "the only way [political parties] have of getting funds."

Public - "[the community] would say 'X' and we [the developers] would say 'we're prepared to give you Y'".

RESOURCES

"....he who pays the piper calls the tune." .

KNOWLEDGE

"We know the planning laws inside out...we know the mechanisms there to get what we want so we use them"

CONTACTS

"[Ireland] is a small country...
the access to the decision
makers is too easy"

HOW POWER IS

EXERCISED

Shift towards more implicit channels of influence as existing ones exposed

"..there's lots of influences without resorting to brown bags, you know, where influence can be brought to bear on Councillors"

"...there's a shift away from the big cheque, but maybe more subtle things are going on".

PLANNING GAIN

"....It's the new brown envelope".

PRE-PLANNING

"....this has been agreed so make it work"

LOBBYING

"...green can turn to gold if enough effort is brought to bear on the power structures within an area"

AGENTS

"There must have been about 20 consultants on behalf of the developers sitting across the table from us and it's quite daunting and intimidating"

HOW POWER BECOMES

MANIFESTED

Outcomes not only reflect power disparities but exacerbate them by distributing wealth upwards...

"...changing a field from agriculture to residential when land values here were kicking one and a half to two million an acre...you had potential paper millionaires overnight on the foot of a planning decision"

"[community 'gain'] is always buttons in comparison to what the [developers] are getting out of it"

UNSUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

ENTREPRENEURIAL PLANNING

"Certain counties can have a more aggressive economic strategy to try and get business in"

MARGINALISATION

"You feel like you're just not listened to, you might as well not be there"

INEQUITABLE OUTCOMES





CONCLUSIONS

- Power is concentrated and highly dynamic in terms of how it behaves
- 'Shadow planning system' exists alongside formal structures
- Distorting effects of power more difficult to detect than ever before
