
UNIVERSITÀ DELLA SVIZZERA ITALIANA (USI)

The Space Industry as the New Frontier of Regional Dynamics

The space economy, associated industrial sectors and value chains are generating significant downstream direct and indirect socio-economic benefits for Europe's regions. The ESA also proposes a long term plan and industrial policy that encompasses objectives and challenges. These include, inter alia, Industry 4.0; technological adaptation and ICT-driven applications; regional innovation milieu and systems; smart cities; and, smart specialisation all of which can be seen to be derived from upstream space activities. This is particular to the underlying technologies of electric/driverless vehicles whose development is likely to transform the urban and regional spatial structure and form in the medium term in many regions of the world.

Within the ESA's Smart 4.0 industrial policy, there is also a commitment to a form of cohesion policy in addressing the needs of underfunded Members States so as to benefit from dynamic changes associated with the space industry. This panel session will discuss these challenges and the role of the space industry in transforming the dynamics of Europe's regions. It will also draw on evidence from the activities of other international space agencies in order to explore differences and commonalties with respect to the achieving ESA objectives.






The ESPON TIA (Territorial Impact Assessment) Web Tool is an interactive web application that can be used to support policy makers and practitioners with identifying potential territorial impacts of new legislation and policies. The tool combines the expert knowledge and judgements about the potential impact with a set of statistical data describing the characteristics of regions. Based on the different sensitivity of regions, the expert judgments are translated into maps showing the potential territorial impact of EU policy on NUTS 3 level. These maps can serve as a starting point for further discussion of different impacts of a concrete EU policy on different regions.







We are living through a period of profound change. New Zealand and Australia occupy a distinctive position in global location, offering opportunities for unique contributions to understanding of regional economies and their dynamics. As proponents of Southern Theory have argued ours is a history of legacies from colonialism, with enduring impacts on the nature and functioning of regions and economies.

The centrality of land-use choices and connections to global markets in shaping the economies of Australasia have impacted on the experiences of First Nations peoples and have challenged capacities for innovation and the forging of new regional futures in a post-industrial world. These realities are pressing as New Zealand and Australia become more tightly embedded in global supply networks and value chains than ever before.

Asian investment is reconfiguring national and regional economies, disrupting long-established relationships with Europe and North America. International students are a central feature of the tertiary education sector in Australia and New Zealand, influencing new investment in our cities. As members of a Trans Pacific Partnership that does not include the US, both nations may see new forms of development that create opportunities and risks for First Nations economies and for regional economies as new markets for land-based products and resources emerge.

Innovation is seen as a way of responding to climate change, social inequalities, economic challenges, the provision of services and the building of infrastructure. Yet it can also be seen as the cause of many of the challenges that cities and regions now face: indeed, in its broadest sense innovation simply means change, and the consequences of many of the changes wrought over the last century and a half are now being understood.

Innovation has been enshrined as a pillar of economic agenda at all governmental scales. The government of Canada's supercluster policy (2018) makes explicit that it sees innovation as linked to regional processes. The policy reflected the wider claim that cities and regions need to innovate yet these are vague claims in need of investigation.

This conference will provide the opportunity for urban and regional scholars to grapple with the complexities of innovation and change, qualifying the idea of innovation, questioning the institutions that organize and channel it, and exploring the actors, private, public and civil society, who instigate change and cope with its consequences. To what extent are innovative processes regionally embedded? Can radical innovation occur within the current institutional context? Who innovates? Who benefits? Is it possible, or useful, to think through the consequences of innovation? Is it always necessary or advisable to innovate? Can innovation lead to more inclusive forms of growth? How does innovation impact cities and regions – in terms of their governance, their economies, their infrastructure and their social cohesion? And, conversely, how do cities and regions, as polities, innovate, influence innovation, adapt to change, and channel its consequences? These are some of the questions that will be addressed in Montreal.
