#### The Activity - RSA Network Meeting in LJMU, Liverpool UK

#### Theme of Meeting - Food-Energy-Transportation Systems Transitions:

The RSA network is organized by Liverpool John Moores University, UK, University Centre of the Westfjord, Iceland and Southern Connecticut State University, USA. This second meeting of the RSA network on Coastal Transitions aimed to expand upon and develop the 'boundaries' and potentials of the research network. Spatial understandings of transitions processes, largely neglected by the academic community to date, were front and centre to discussions.
