How can divergent trajectories in the context of climate, economic, security and polarisation crises be explained?

This conference, convened jointly by ANZRSI and the Regional Studies Association (RSA), will bring together researchers from Asia, Europe, Australasia and beyond to examine these and related questions. The event will be hosted by the European Union Centre at RMIT on 26-28 November 2023. It will be an in-person conference, although opportunities for on-line presentation and streaming will be available.
